On behalf of the Iowa State USBC WBA, thanks to all of you who entered our annual BVL Mail-in-Tournament in 2014. We had a total of 543 entries from the Greater Cedar Valley. Way to go bowlers. We were top in the state again.

As the manager of this tournament, I was able to send a check to BVL for \$12180.38 this year to help support our Veterans in the state of Iowa and this nation. This included the entries from the tournament, donations, items sold and tournament checks returned as donations.

When sending in our donations to BVL, I ask that \$3000 be used for the National TEE Tournament at Riverside Iowa and a portion to the 3 VA facilities in Iowa. This year, BVL added another \$3000 to the TEE Tournament.

Checks in the amount of \$2000 were presented to the Iowa City VA and the Marshalltown VA. We will also be presenting the Des Moines check in the near future. The Marshalltown VA uses our funds for their Veterans Bowling League. The Veterans pay little to the bowling center because of these funds we donated. Wow, they are enjoying our sport!!

Some of the state board members helped at the bowling and golfing venues at the TEE Tournament in Iowa City. What an honor to help the 67 legally blind and handicapped Veterans enjoy our support. We have made new friends seeing some of the same people year after year and look forward to helping them again next year. I was able to speak about the Iowa bowlers who helped support this week of entertainment for them through the BVL and about our bowling tournament we hold each year. I told them the bowlers of Iowa will never forget them.

This year's BVL Tournament will be the week of Nov 8-14. Either I, another board member, league secretary or an employee of the bowling centers will be around asking for your \$5 for your entry. What an easy way to help us support our Veterans.

Please help us keep the promise that was made in 1942, "We will never forget you".

SENIOR WOMEN'S TOURNAMENT 2016

Women's tournaments will dominate the scene here in the Cedar Valley this season as Waverly Bowl Inn prepares to host the 2016 Senior Women's Tournament. Any woman, at least 55, may bowl this tournament which is held in different venues around the state each year.

Tournament dates are April 30, May 1, 7, and 14 & 15. You have your choice of 2 squads on Saturdays, 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. One squad only is offered on Sundays at 11:00 a.m.

The tournament features a doubles and singles format only with 2 divisions offered. Divisions are determined by age, not average. If you are aged 55-64, you will be bowling Division 2 while the bowlers older than 65 will be in Division 1. The division for doubles is figured by adding the 2 bowlers ages together and if the total is 110-129, you will be in Division 2 while 130 and above will be Division 1.

This tournament is USBC certified and handicap is based on 100% of 220.

Entry forms will be available in all centers by January 1, 2016. Entries close April 1, 2016.

With this tournament being held so close to home we would like to see many of the senior women in the Cedar Valley bowling at Waverly Bowl Inn next spring.

This tournament features 4 person teams as well as doubles and singles. The tournament is handicapped at 100% of a 240 base.

This tournament draws bowlers from around the nation and will keep us busy weekends from May 21 through June 26, 2016. Over the course of those 6 weekends we hope to host at least 1000 teams right here in Waterloo, IA.

This tournament was first held in 2013 in Lansing, MI, in South Bend, IN in 2014 and in Rockford, IL in 2015. The tournament has grown from 802 teams the initial year to 936 teams last year.

Entries are available at the 3 centers here in the Cedar Valley and are also available on the Iowa State website: www.iowawba.com. Get your reservations in soon! Although you have until April 21, 2016 to get your entries in, we encourage you to get them in sooner rather than later to secure your spot.

Teams event will be contested at Maple Lanes with the doubles and singles being held at Cadillac Lanes. We have two outstanding centers here in Waterloo and are so lucky to be able to host a tournament of this magnitude.
