

Lane Inspections Certification By President Connie Rommel

How many of you know that the lanes at all three of our area bowling centers need to be certified each year in order to be USBC certified? Did you know that your local Board of Directors and association volunteers perform this before you start bowling in the fall?

Lanes Certification is done to verify the lanes are in compliance with USBC specifications. Without this inspection, the lanes could be warped, shorter/longer in length, narrower/wider in width, foul lines not working, pins not spotting properly, gutters to deep/shallow, and many other minor concerns.

Measurements are taken on the pin deck between the kick plates (sides) and must be between 60" and 60~1/4". Gutters are measured and must be between 3~3/8" and 3 5/8" deep. Crosswise tilt (side to side) of the pin deck must be with 40/1000". The lengthwise tilt (front to back) can be no more than 187/1000". Crosswise tilts are also taken three different areas of the lane bed and depressions are taken on three specific boards on each lane. The bowling lane is 60 feet long with an additional 2', 10 3/16" of pin deck and an approach of a minimum of 15 feet. The width of the lane is 41~1/2 inches. Bowling pins must weigh between 3 lbs., 6 ozs. and 3 lbs., 10 ozs and are 15 inches high and must be USBC certified.

Lane dressing checks are made a minimum of

once a year per USBC at each center. The dressing is checked with a lane dressing pick-up device. The tape used is 1" transparent tape applied to the lane with the adhesive side down and then another piece of tape is applied as the pick-up device picks the tape up removing the oil from the lane and incases the oil between the two tapes. The tape is put into a tape reading machine reading the units of oil of each of the boards on the lane bed. A minimum of three units of oil must be on each board across the lane.

All these checks are done by your association to safeguard the proprietors investment, protect your equipment and maintain scoring potential. If gutters are too deep it will prevent pin action, a gutter to shallow could create excessive pin action and therefore each could affect scoring. The lanes checks being done in the fall will help with consistency and standardization at our centers. 


